In my travels through the neighborhood, I see many lawns, shrubs, and even trees dried brown from the many days of triple digit temperatures. We also hear about all the brush fires being fought throughout the State. Many black patches along the highways are evidence of a previous grass fire. Now that we are being restricted from watering, even more of our landscape will suffer. This will make our house surroundings vulnerable for a fire. Smokers, please extinguish and dispose of your lit cigarettes properly to avoid a catastrophe. We don't need any mishaps in our neighborhood. Also when charcoal grilling, do not leave your grill fire unattended.

Another area of concern is our house foundation. With only two days of watering, we must take extra steps to keep our foundations wet to avoid structural damage. One suggestion is to install soaker hoses around the house periphery. Also use hand hose watering since there are no day or time restriction as long as the hose has a shutoff at the end.

Last but not least, for those of you who are fortunate to have a backyard pool to cool off in, protect your feet from the deck heat. The pavement temperature can exceed 140 degrees.

City of Plano Stage 2 Water Conservation & Restrictions

At the direction of the North Texas Municipal Water District, the City of Plano has entered into Stage 2 Water Conservation Measures. The Plano City Council adopted a different approach to watering restrictions, while continuing to limit watering to 2-days per week.

New Landscape Watering Restrictions – Effective August 23, 2011

Irrigation watering should be programmed for 2-days per week based on your home address:

Even House Number: Monday & Thursday Only Odd House Number: Tuesday & Friday Only Watering is prohibited between 10:00am-6:00pm.

Water Conservation Stage Information:

- ✓ Prevent water runoff from your lawn into the street or onto hard surfaces.
- ☑ Watering your lawn is prohibited from 10AM-6PM from April 1st October 31st.
- ✓ Watering your lawn with sprinklers or irrigation systems is only allowed two times per week (some exceptions).
- ☑ Planting of cool season grasses like rye is prohibited.
- The use of treated water to fill or refill residential, amenity, and any other natural or manmade ponds is prohibited.
- Wait until after the drought to establish new landscaping.

Hand watering or use of soaker hoses or drip irrigation is acceptable any day of the week, any time of day, provide there is no run off. For additional information visit **www.plano.gov/water** or **www.livegreenplano.com**

The City of Plano needs the cooperation of all home owners/residents to help reduce water consumption by 5%. We appreciate your support and it is critical for everyone to do their part and conserve water.



Crime Watch by Dave Nichols

August 11 was the semi-annual Crime Watch coordinators meeting at City Hall. This is always hosted by Plano Police and there is a general information session as well as area break-outs with our assigned police officers. Here are some highlights.

The police stressed in abundance that Crime Watch has three basic functions: know your neighbors, report suspicious activity to the police on 911, and to pass along crime information and tips for prevention to help keep the neighborhood aware and strong. At the bare minimum, every one of us should know the neighbors on either side, the three houses directly across the street, and the neighbor directly behind. Several officers told us that a profusion of crime was halted because of watchful neighbors calling 911. If you see a suspicious person, a suspicious vehicle or suspicious activity CALL 911.



Plano Police repeated to us that if you get a knock on your door and it is someone you don't know, yell through the door and tell them you are not interested. This is important because if it is a thief casing your house, that person now knows there is someone home. A common excuse by the thief is to ask if the "Smith's live here" (or a made-up name). Do not open the door to a person you suspect. Houses with no one there are the prime targets.

Large dogs are wonderful as a deterrent.

If you experience a barking dog that won't quiet down, a loud party in the wee hours, solicitors leaving fliers on doors marked "no soliciting", or any other non-emergency situation that needs the attention of police, call the non-emergency Plano Police line at 972-424-5678.

An arrest of a car break-in burglar in June has reduced the number and frequency of car break-ins within Pitman Creek North.

Two solicitors going door to door were leaving fliers at doors marked "no soliciting". A police officer on routine patrol spotted this on Sacramento and halted the two solicitors. He did permit and ID checks and found that BOTH men had warrants for their arrest. The men were arrested and taken to jail.

Welcome Wagon

Currently in PCN, there are 9 houses for sale. Since June of 2011, three houses have sold.

As the houses sell, and new residents move in, the 'Welcome Committee' calls on them and leaves a packet of information about our subdivision. A neighborly welcome is delivered, names and numbers exchanged, and questions answered.

I have recently taken over this committee, after our last leader moved to the hill country. I have strongly

encouraged all 'block leaders' to keep an eye on their area, and notify me when a new neighbor moves in. The more 'eyes' keeping watch



over an area, the better! If you know of a new resident that needs a welcome, please contact me!
