


1. How long have you lived in the Pitman Creek North neighborhood?

2. Do you own or rent/lease your home in Pitman Creek North?




3. What do you think makes Pitman Creek North neighborhood special?


- Neighborhood feel; friendliness; warmth; pride in neighborhood

- 4. If you could change or improve our neighborhood, what would you do?
 - Enforce maintenance of houses and landscaping/lawns; better home or property standards/pride
 - Signage/change to make more modern; improve entryway sign
 - Get rid of pink walls; walls are ugly/cheap-looking
 - Visibility from main entrance to westbound traffic on 15th St. is poor

- More street lights
- Alley maintenance/fences in disrepair; clean-up junk in alley; alleys ignored by many residents and are a problem
- Don't park in front of mailboxes; mail unable to be delivered because of cars blocking boxes
- Too much street parking, especially renters
- More social engagement
- More benches and a restroom at Hackberry Park; more improvements to park
- More stop signs, especially on Huron
- Potential ugliest yard award; get volunteers to help clean up the award winner
- Renters are a problem taking up all of parking/not using driveways and garages
- Ban short-term rentals
- Would like text/email notification whenever there are crime issues in area
- Dogs off leash walking on property and leaving deposits
- More social engagement; get to know neighbors better
- Encourage garage parking vs. street parking; too much street parking
- Professional landscape services; professional design would provide a more comprehensive plan that would increase attractiveness of neighborhood and property values; improve island gardens, more xeriscaping
- More participation by homeowners in HOA; provide more opportunities to neighbors to interact
- Hope that HOA keeps eye on land development nearby; prefer home development vs. apartments or businesses
- Stop people from letting pets poop/peeing in parking strip/front yard and not cleaning up.
- Stop landscaping services people blowing leaves, grass clippings and or vegetation into the gutter/other yards (against City of Plano ordinances).
- Remove island on Columbia (hazard/impediment to first responders); no longer needed/are a public nuisance
- Have Street or Block parties
- Get rid of squirrels; neighborhood is overrun with squirrels big problem
- Encourage people to take pride in their home/neighborhood
- Have a place where neighbors can ask for help with something that community members may be able to do short-term (lawn care, etc.)
- Figure out how to have smaller, targeted/same interest groups to build community; keeping ongoing activities in front of everyone as in newsletter. Ask if people want to know their neighbors


5. On a scale of 1 to 5, how important do you think an HOA is to your neighborhood?

8. If no, please tell us what keeps you from becoming a part of the Pitman Creek North HOA?


- Want something done about the speeding done on Rio Grande

 - Am over-volunteered currently but wouldn't mind passing along neighborhood messages to my block


10. Would you be interested in donating to a special improvement project in the neighborhood, and if so, what would that improvement project be?
